



Church-based

The mission of Moms In Touch International, an interdenominational prayer ministry, is to impact children and schools worldwide for Christ by gathering mothers to pray regularly (weekly is optimal). Women in a local community may choose to meet together in an area church to pray for their children and the schools they attend. Several schools and all ages of children may be represented. During the intercession time, members are grouped by the age level of their children or similar schools. Ideally, each school represented would be prayed for each week.

To begin

- Read the *MITI Booklet* thoroughly and become familiar with the Four Steps of Prayer and One Accord Praying.
- Agree with the MITI Statement of Faith in the *MITI Booklet* and online under About Us.
- Become familiar with the Core Values of Moms In Touch International online under About Us.
- Abide by MITI Policies in the *MITI Booklet* and online under About Us.
- Ask God for at least one other woman with whom you can pray.
- Choose a place and time convenient for you to meet.
- Register the group at www.MomsInTouch.org: include the leader's name and information, as well as the schools being prayed for.
- Encourage your members to go online and register as a member, or with their permission you may register them as members on their behalf.

Helpful suggestions

- Offer to teach the MITI prayer curriculum, *Igniting a Passion to Pray*, as a way to introduce Moms In Touch to the church.
- Suggest publicity for the various promotional venues in the church (bulletin inserts, promotional DVD, poster, etc). For more information visit Get the Word Out on the MITI website.

- During the intercession time, please consider the following:
 - Have each member choose one child to pray for that week.
 - Pray for that child's school or future school.
 - Divide into smaller groups of twos or threes if the size of the group allows.
